LIVING IN CONTINUAL CONVERSION

Spiritual conversion, according to Pope Benedict, refers to an ongoing process of a series of turnings, e.g. from a state of sin to repentance, from a lax to a more earnest and serious way of life, from unbelief to faith, from heresy to the true faith. It consists not merely in joining a Church but in a change of heart. (Ash Wednesday general audience, celebrated Wednesday, 2-17-2010.) The Holy Father said: "conversion means changing the direction of the path of our lives. It is going against the current when the 'current' is a superficial, incoherent, and illusory way of life that often drags us down, making us slaves of evil or prisoners of moral mediocrity."

There are many in the Communion of Saints that provide models of conversion. A classic example of a saint who experienced a major conversion is St. Augustine. His life as a young man was characterized by loose living and a search for answers to life's basic questions. He became disillusioned with various philosophies that he studied recognizing he was unable to get satisfactory answers to his questions. Sometime in the year 386, Augustine and his friend [Alypius](#) were spending time in Milan. While outdoors, Augustine heard the voice of a child singing a song, the words of which were, "Pick it up and read it. Pick it up and read it." He thought at first that the song was related to some kind of children's game, but could not remember ever having heard such a song before. Then, realizing that this song might be a command from God to open and read the Scriptures, he located a Bible, picked it up, opened it and read the first passage he saw. It was from the Letter of Paul to the Romans. Augustine read: "*Not in carousing and drunkenness, not in sexual excess and lust, not in quarreling and jealousy. Rather, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the desires of the flesh.*" (Romans 13: 13-14.) Reading this scripture, Augustine felt as if his heart were flooded with light. He turned totally from his life of sin. He was baptized by Ambrose during the Easter Vigil April 24, 387.

Pope Benedict states that conversion has two dimensions. (Homily at Vespers for the Conversion of Saint Paul on January 26, 2009) In the first step, we recognize our faults in the light of Christ. This recognition becomes sorrow and repentance and a desire for a new beginning. In the second step, we recognize that this new road cannot come from us. It consists in letting ourselves be conquered by Christ. As St. Paul says: "I continue my pursuit in hope that I may possess it, since I have indeed been conquered by Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:12). Most of us do not experience major conversions such as those felt by St. Augustine, St. Francis and many other great saints. Instead, for us, conversion is an ongoing process we experience as we travel the path of life. In my own situation, I reflect on spiritual activities such as a Life in the Spirit seminar, SFO Profession, Week-end Retreats, Diaconate Study, etc. Through these and other events, people, and teachings the Holy Spirit connected these externals with the internal quest for a closer relationship with my God through Jesus Christ.

According to Pope Benedict, "through the conversion process, we trust in the living and personal Gospel who is Jesus Christ. (Vespers, 2009) He is the final goal and the profound path of conversion. It is the path that we are all called to travel in our lives, allowing ourselves to be illuminated with his light and sustained by his strength which moves our steps. Conversion demands our yes and pursuit; it is not ultimately my activity, but a gift, a letting ourselves be formed by Christ; it is death and resurrection." Through conversion, we become "one" in Christ!

PARKING LOT TRAFFIC FLOW

Please notice the traffic flow pattern of our parking lot on Sunday.

It **DOES NOT** permit exiting onto Mantoloking Road near the Church. Exiting onto Mantoloking Road is specific to the Old Church roadway nearest the Rectory building.

Exiting by the Church is dangerous. If this persists the Brick Police Department will ticket offenders for obstructing traffic.
